Your child will:

- Read the Storm Whale, Seashore, The Sea Saw and Three by the Sea as focus Literacy books.
- Children will join in with Sentence Accuracy daily which builds their stamina and fluency in writing.
- Write independently and use the sentence checker daily.
- Retell stories confidently using Story Friends, Octopus Opening, Build Up Bear, Problem Penguin, Elephant Ending.

Your child will:

- begin to explore different ways of catching with one/ two hands

Your child will:


- Bring a new reading for pleasure book home every Friday

- Children will listen to a variety of music with a pulse and move in time with it. They will be encouraged to respond to changes: they could jump when the music suddenly becomes louder, for example.

Your child will:

- Observe animal and plant life-cycles, identify key features and new vocabulary.
- Praw information from a simple map.
- Name and describe common animals (examples of fish, amphibians,
