

Two Queens called Elizabeth



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Teachers Notes:

The unit aims to explore the historical concepts of similarity and difference over time. The unit will support pupils in grasping longer chronological narratives through comparing the lives of two women.

During the unit, pupils will gradually build their vocabulary of key substantive concepts such as **monarchy** whilst developing a sense of change over time, and that the past is often very similar to the present.

The unit uses a variety of **primary sources** and provides questions that you can use to support pupils' **critical thinking**, for example,

Why did Elizabeth I only let her friends paint her picture?

Also the unit helps pupils develop their **inference** skills, such as what you can and cannot learn from a picture.

What does the painting not tell us about the Spanish Armada?

The unit also highlights out the connectives that support pupils writing whilst repeating the key idea behind the concept of similarity and difference.

The booklet is designed as a resource for you to use with the children. You can pick elements of the booklet for your slides and to photocopy for lessons.






Who was Queen Elizabeth II?

The current monarch is King Charles II. He inherited the throne when his mother died. He is the eldest son of Queen Elizabeth II who died in 2022.

Queen Elizabeth II **reigned** for longer than any other monarch in British history, becoming a **significant** and **respected** figure across the globe.



Queen Elizabeth II was born in London in 1926. She **inherited** the throne in 1952 when she was 25 years old. She died in 2022, when she was 96 years old. You might remember when she died as this is within your living memory.

New words

Queen - a very important woman who rules the country.

Monarchy - a country ruled by a king or queen.

Reign – how long a king or queen is the monarch.

Inherited - received after someone dies.

Head of State- is head of the country with no power

Coronation – When a King or Queen are crowned

Queen Elizabeth II as a child



Born 1926

The Queen was born on the 21st April 1926 in London. Instead of going to school, teachers would go to her house and educate her at home. Elizabeth learnt how to speak French. She also learnt to ride horses and became a great swimmer. She also became a Girl Guide. She had a sister called Margaret.

The Second World War before she became Queen.



A significant event



In 1939, Britain went to war with Germany. The war lasted six years.





During the war, the Queen learnt how to fix cars and vans. She also learnt how to drive. She was only 18 years old.



Queen Elizabeth married the Duke of Edinburgh in 1946 **before** she became Queen in 1952. They had four children. Their eldest son is called Charles. He is now King. He inherited the throne when his mother died in 2022 and was crowned King in 2023.




The Queen is crowned 1952



Elizabeth became Queen in 1952 <u>after</u> her father died. She was crowned in Westminster Abbey in London and lived in Buckingham Palace. She was <u>25</u> <u>years old</u>.

Many things changed


500 years ago

Well, there were <u>two</u> queens called Elizabeth. The first Queen Elizabeth lived many years ago.




Queen Elizabeth I was born almost 500 years ago, in 1533. She became queen in 1558 when she was 25 years old like Elizabeth II. She died in 1603 when she was 69 years old. She was the queen for 45 years.





Elizabeth I did not go to school and was educated at home. Her father was King Henry the VIII.



When Elizabeth I was just three years old, her mother, Anne Boleyn, was executed. Elizabeth I's childhood was full of uncertainty.

The Queen took pride in her appearance and made sure she always looked her best in her fine dresses and expensive jewellery.

She never got married as she said she was married to the country instead. The queen loved sweet things and she had many rotten teeth.

Elizabeth was clever and well educated and could speak seven languages.



The role of the Queen

Elizabeth I ruled in a time when things were different from today. Queen Elizabeth I was in charge of a whole country. She could execute people she didn't trust like her cousin, Mary Queen of Scots in 1586. She made big decisions and told everyone what to do. The queen had lots of gold and precious things. This made her a **powerful** queen.


The Spanish Armada A significant event



During Queen Elizabeth I's time, there was a big battle called...

The Spanish Armada. This was a famous battle at sea between England and the country of Spain.

Spain and England are friendly with each other these days, but in those days, they were enemies and argued a lot.




When Elizabeth I was queen of England, Spain had a monarch called King Philip of Spain.

The two monarchs had many reasons to dislike each other and didn't trust each other at all.







Philip wanted to take over England so he launched a great fleet of ships, known as the **Spanish Armada in 1588.** They set sail to conquer England and take Elizabeth's crown!



Elizabeth told her sailors to fight the Spanish ships. Then, a huge storm drove the Spanish ships away. Only half of the 130 ships made it back to Spain. The English won. This made Elizabeth very happy and popular.





This painting is a primary source. **Primary sources** are **from** the time.




